PURPOSE AND GENERAL INFORMATION

On July 13, 2026, to protect the interests of the United States, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) issued an updated Order restricting entry into the United States of persons who have been present in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC), Uganda, or South Sudan during the preceding 21 days. The Transportation Security Administration (TSA) is issuing this Information Circular (IC), in accordance with 49 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) parts 1544 and 1546, to protect the United States from the serious risk posed by the introduction of Ebola into the United States based on the emergent outbreak of Ebola caused by the Bundibugyo virus strain. Although the recommended measures in this IC are voluntary, not implementing them may have cascading public health, economic, national security, and societal consequences that may force TSA to issue mandatory measures.

RECOMMENDED MEASURES

- A. To assist the traveling public in adhering to the restrictions imposed by the CDC on passengers arriving from the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC), Uganda, and South Sudan, aircraft operators and foreign air carriers may post, at the time of booking, the following message onto their reservations system:

To reduce the risk of Ebola importation into the United States, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is temporarily restricting U.S. entry for travelers who were recently in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC). Travelers, including Americans, who have been in the DRC within 21 days of their flight will not be allowed to board commercial flights with destinations to the United States. All U.S. citizens and U.S. nationals who have been in the DRC should plan to remain outside the DRC for 21 days before entering the United States.

U.S. citizens and U.S. nationals who have been present in Uganda, or South Sudan (and not present in DRC) within 21 days of arrival in the United States must only enter through designated airports for enhanced screening.
